Mentees Get Paid \$\$\$ for Good Grades

This is the 2nd year we have been awarded a grant from Coca-Cola to implement Project SOAR (Student Opportunities, Access and Readiness). Project SOAR expands The 100's Success Academy via the Virtual Mentee Curriculum, leveraging technology for virtual



training, and compensating Mentees for good grades. Our goal is to help our Mentees achieve successful gradelevel advancement, on-

time graduation, and realize their educational, personal and professional goals. Last year the average GPA of our Mentees in SOAR increased from 2.9 to 3.1 within only two marking periods. Three of our Mentees (Cameron Rogers, Brandon Craddock, and Mikayla Hammond) received \$250 bonuses for excelling with straight "A" perfect 4.0 GPA grade reports.

Boys Read Club

100 Black Men of Prince George's County is committed to supporting and promoting a holistic full spectrum growth of our Mentees.

In today's internet, social media and other electronic-based environments, communication through reading is a required skill that is necessary for achieving success. Research has consistently demonstrated that reading proficiency is a critical factor in achievement.

Steve Sanfield's 'A Natural Man', PBS, February 2016 stated that only 14% of Black eighth graders score at or above proficiency. The 100 Black Men of Prince George's County, Inc. determined that this is unacceptable. The 100 Black Men has collaborated and partnered with the Prince George's County Memorial Library System in an effort to improve literacy rates for our youths while fostering in them, a passion for reading.

The Boys Read Club, which is part of the 100 Black Men of Prince George's County Inc., is the focus of this effort. The Boys Read Club helps young men ages five to fifteen years old, improve their reading, comprehension, diction and verbal communication skills. Mentees learn to express personal ideas while remaining open to the ideas of others. The Boys Read Club also enables Mentees to practice skills that will help improve their quality of life.

Hands on Banking

The Wells Fargo Hands on Banking Program forges relationships with youth ages 11-18 in order to help them become people of character with strong values. The program endeavors to guide youth in establishing and attaining their goals through hard work and commitment. The "100" encourages young people to be leaders and Mentors in their own communities, placing special emphasis on the importance of service to others.



Students have been participating in this bi-weekly Hands on Banking course with a specific focus on teaching economic empowerment.

- 1. Increase their understanding of financial literacy and learn key banking terms
- 2. Understand the importance of making good financial choices such as establishing a budget and learn the importance of saving money
- 3. Learn about the US Banking System and its importance in our economy
- 4. Have open discussions about Banking, Entrepreneurship, and Credit
- 5. Interact with those in the fields of Finance, Banking and Real Estate

Additionally, we introduced an Investment Challenge with a cash award to introduce the stock market to our Mentees. 100 Black Men Financial Management Experts facilitate stock market research, investment fundamentals, and the purchase and sale of stock via an online simulator.
