## MENTORING

## EDUCATION

Although segregation in the U.S. ended over 50 years ago, significant inequities in public education still exist today. We consider the transformation of education as one of the critical civil rights issues of our time; and staunchly believe that all youth, regardless of race and socio-economic status, must have access to quality education to become ready to compete in a global society. Knowledge is power if you have access to it and can properly apply it.

## HEALTH AND WELLNESS

The 100 focuses on the well-being of the whole person: physical, emotional, psychological, and spiritual through initiatives that: 1) raise awareness of health disparities and solutions; and 2) provide access to health care and wellness information that promote behavioral changes that result in healthier lifestyles, good nutrition, regular physical activity, and full ownership of one’s health. At the national and local level, our organization partners with corporations, foundations and other nonprofit organizations to promote preventative health strategies and provide education on prevalent diseases that negatively impact African Americans. Through these partnerships, The 100 delivers health education programs in hundreds of communities annually. Healthy children can become healthy adults; and healthy adults contribute to the overall health of our communities.

## ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

The 100 Black Men of Prince George’s, Inc. County considers economic empowerment necessary for creating just societies around the world. The 100 defines economic empowerment as the ability to be self-determined in creating dreams, pursuing them and ultimately perpetuating them by establishing the mechanisms to sustain generational wealth. Our program initiatives promote generational economic self-sufficiency through financial literacy, family wealth building, and entrepreneurship.

The words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. resonate as profoundly today as they did in 1967 when he declared, “The dignity of the individual will flourish when the decisions concerning his life are in his own hands; when he has the means to seek self-improvement.” The 100 fosters the ability of its mentees and members to be self-determined in creating dreams, pursuing them and ultimately perpetuating those dreams and aspirations by establishing the mechanisms to sustain generational wealth. Through comprehensive curricula and training opportunities, our organization works diligently to promote economic self-sufficiency and break the cycle of generational debt. Our economic empowerment programs and initiatives foster financial literacy, career development, financial planning, investment management, and fiscal responsibility at an early age.

## MENTORING THE 100 WAY

Mentoring is the cornerstone of 100 Black Men of Prince George's County, Inc. Behind every fact is a face. Behind every statistic is a story. Behind every catch phrase is a young person whose future will be lost if something is not done immediately to change his or her reality. We operate mentoring programs that seek to change the trajectory of our youth. Research confirms that quality mentor relationships have powerful positive effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic, and career situations. Ultimately, mentoring connects a young person to personal growth and development, and social and economic opportunity. Yet, according to the National Mentoring Partnership, it is projected that 16 million young people, including 9 million at-risk young people, will reach adulthood without connecting with a mentor of any kind.

In addition to helping to improve the heart health of participants, this event also focuses on bringing awareness to mental health disorders. This event helps promote healthy living in the community, one step at a time.
3. **100 Eyes on Health (September 2019)** In partnership with the City of District Heights, our 100 Eyes on Health Fair is our way of demonstrating our commitment to supporting the health and wellness of Prince George's County residents. This free, all day festival includes, activities and vendor tables that promote healthy living, including diabetes screenings, cholesterol screenings, blood pressure screenings, complimentary gym memberships, yoga demonstrations, and other activities to educate the community on how to achieve healthy lifestyles.
4. **100Way Golf Event (October 2019)** Our 100Way Golf Event is not a traditional golf tournament but an extension of our golf mentoring program. We embed our emerging golfers into foursomes with our attendees and play just nine holes that will be preceded with a swing clinic led by a PGA professional. An instant hit with our donors, the 100Way Golf Event allows our supporters to interact directly with the youth we serve and witness firsthand the impact our mentoring has on young people. At the end of the event is an awards ceremony where we acknowledge the golfing skills of our mentees and our attendees.
5. **Holiday Party (December 2019)** Its never too early to begin thinking about the holidays. Our Annual Holiday Party has become a community staple during the holiday season and each year we fill the Historic Newton White Mansion in Mitchellville, Maryland with hundreds of our strongest community supporters. Dressed to impress, our community supporters attend this event to fellowship with friends and special guests, support our chosen holiday-themed charitable cause, and learn about our nonprofit's plans for the upcoming year.
